2018 Holiday Update

The number of families served over the holidays increased again in 2018. The wonderful generosity of those in the Hickory Nut Gorge was evident, as Outreach received donations from community members, churches and business partners. Many families were able to provide a wonderful Thanksgiving and Christmas as a result of your support.

- ♦ # of families who received Thanksgiving meal boxes: 201 (15% increase over 2018)
- # of families who received Christmas gift cards/meals: 213 (26% increase over 2018)
- # of children who received Angel Tree gifts: 248
 (20% increase over 2018)
