#### About Our New Facility

Outreach volunteers spent over 1000 hours cleaning, painting, organizing, packing and unpacking, and the new facility is now fully up and running. The Food Pantry is now double in size, and there is plenty of additional space for storage. With support from grants awarded by the RHI Legacy Foundation and CFWNC, Outreach now has two shopping areas, a consultation room and plenty of space for storage. The storage space enables us to shop for sales, purchase items in large quantities when appropriate, and manage the inventory. Additionally, clients now receive 5 -7 days of food per month, up from 3-5 days.

A Grand Opening and Ribbon Cutting ceremony was held February 6<sup>th</sup>, and the Outreach Board welcomed community leaders and residents to the monthly Hickory Nut Gorge Chamber of Commerce Recharge Meeting held at Outreach in March. Both were wonderful opportunities to educate the public about the changes made at Outreach and the services provided to community members in need of support. Getting to showcase the new facility was great fun. Thanks to everyone that came out!














